However, some critics feel that 'nothing is agreed until everything is agreed' and as such there is still some uncertainty as to where this leaves the economy and the people currently living in the UK as EU nationals.

A deadline of October 2018 has been set for trade talks and there have been warning that the NHS and other important institutions would 'collapse' if foreign nationals couldn't stay.

European governments and business leaders generally welcomed the breakthrough but warned that the most difficult negotiations lay ahead. There was "still much work for ne-

gotiators to do", a German government spokesman said. German businesses said they must know soon "what model Britain proposes".

The final divorce is expected in March 2019, and by that point there also needs to be agreement on security policies.
