Grenfell Tragedy

Behailu Kebede, the flat resident, was awoken by the fire alarm blaring and phoned the fire brigade immediately, at 00:54.

Four fire engines were sent straight to the scene as the fire began to spread around the building. It spread from the easterly side of the building to the north face of the tower at a swift pace. After only thirty minutes of the fire crew being at the scene, it had spread to the top floor of the east side of the building -this was at 01:26. At 01:42, it had moved to the north side of the building; at 01:52, it had moved to the south side.

At one point, there was over forty fire engines at the scene. Sixty-five people were rescued from the building whilst others scrambled to the top, not knowing how to escape. At 02:30, the building was reported to be officially "covered in fire". It was a "major incident".

After a major enquiry, it was discovered that the cause of the fire spreading so quickly was down to the design of the building and the materials used.

Unfortunately, the blaze was unable to burn itself out until 01:14, twenty-four hours later. Despite the resilience of the fire crew, seventy-two people lost their lives in this horrific blaze.

A major investigation is still underway, from a public inquiry ordered by Theresa May. The Metropolitan Police are investigating suspects for manslaughter, corporate manslaughter, misconduct in public office and breaches of fire safety regulations all in regards to the fire. Over thirty-one million documents have been gathered! As well as two thousand, five hundred physical exhibits, one thousand, one hundred and forty-four witnesses and three hundred and eighty-three companies!

One year on, on the 14th June 2018, a memorial service takes place at St. Helen's Church -near to the tower in West London. Labour MP David Lammy attended the service as commented that it was "bittersweet" whilst the community share this important time of remembrance together. A seventy-two second silence was also held across the country in remembrance of the seventy-two people that have passes away from this unfortunate tragedy.

Clarrie Mendy organised the anniversary service that was attended by hundreds of people. She commented, "It's a service of healing, community, inclusivity and solidarity, to know we are not alone." She, herself, lost two family members due to this incident.

White roses were handed out and doves were set free after the service. A green theme filled the ceremony as the colour was adopted from the survivors and relatives of all those who had passed. Also, hundreds took part in the walk to the base of the tower which took place after the respectful ceremony. It was a beautiful time of gathering and to remember the lives of those who had been killed from this fire.

We now wish the best for all of those who have lost their family and friends due to this horrible incident. You will be in our hopes and prayers here at St. Edmund's.

Clash of the Titans

On June 12th 2018, Donald Trump and Kim Jong-Un met in Singapore to discuss current affairs, a talk that will be remembered in history as the first between the two countries for reasons surrounding past events between the two countries. Anti-America museums are still standing in Pyongyang (the capital city of North Korea).

Prior to the event, the North Korean media stated that there they could "establish a new relationship" with the United States -a shift from the country's previous strong hostility towards the U.S. Meanwhile, Mr Trump announced that he has a "good feeling" and can "feel the excitement in the air".

President Trump hopes that the talk was the start of the process to allow North Korea to surrender their nuclear weapons. Secretary of State, Mike Pompeo, announced that the U.S. was willing to propose "unique" security guarantees to the opposing country. Also, to allow them to understand that the denuclearisation was "not something that would end badly for them". Later, it was stressed that the same objective would not change. However, North Korea's aims have not been revealed. Singapore's Foreign Minister, Vivian Balakrishnan, said that both of the leaders were feeling "supremely confident".

During Donald Trump's first year as president, the two countries have repeatedly been making bitter exchanges towards another as North Korea conducted several ballistic missile tests in defiance of the international community. The U.S. president chose to tighten UN sanctions and to get China, a traditional ally of North Korea, on board with the idea. Also, he vowed to unleash "fire and fury" if Pyongyang continued to threaten the U.S. Mr. Kim responded by naming him as "mentally deranged".



North Korea have spent decades building up their own weapons collection -at a great personal cost! It has enabled them to reach the potential of becoming a nuclear state that is able to send missiles to the U.S. successfully - or so North Korea's Supreme Leader claims.

However, an unpredictable turnaround happened in early 2018 when North Korea and South Korea united to form a joint team at the Winter Olympics. Could this have been the start of a turnaround for North Korea?

From the meeting, not much has changed to the public eye. Both countries have kept the majority of the information secret. But, the U.S. and North Korea are no longer exchanging harsh remarks. Pyongyang's nuclear testing has come to an apparent halt. South Korea and U.S. have also discontinued their joint testing as well -for the time being. All of this is now removing the fiery sparks of tension that were in the atmosphere.

Although a conference did take place, all of the hard work is still to be done. The summit did not provide any answers to any of the questions that have been circling this particular event:

Could this be the start to a successful alliance between the two countries? Will this be the beginning of the end of North Korea's nuclear weapons testing? What are the aims of North Korea? Is North Korea on the path of change?

The questions remain unanswered.

IT'S COMING HOME

ENGLAND steeled themselves for Tuesday's meeting with Colombia as this fascinating World Cup kicked off the knock out stages on Saturday.
